Gaming Machines

Gaming machines are an exciting form of gaming that is great fun and very easy to play. The Reef Hotel Casino offers a large selection of gaming machines for your enjoyment.

A selection of machines are linked to 'progressive jackpots', this may be a large selection or just one machine. The value of the jackpot is shown on or above the machine. The jackpot will increase as more games are played. This can be won randomly or by a set combination, or a certain feature may randomly appear to trigger a jackpot win.

The operation, pay lines and schedule can be found on all machines, however this varies from machine to machine.

How To Play A Gaming Machine

There are many different types of gaming machines at the Reef Hotel Casino. To play a game, insert either \$1 coins or 5, 10 or 20 dollar notes. Each coin or note you insert increases the machine's credit meter.

1 cent game	\$1 dollar = 100 credits
2 cent game	\$1 dollar = 50 credits
5 cent game	\$1 dollar = 20 credits
10 cent game	\$1 dollar = 10 credits
20 cent game	\$1 dollar = 5 credits
50 cent game	\$1 dollar = 2 credits
1 dollar game	\$1 dollar = 1 credit

Next, select the number of credits and the number of lines you wish to play. With each game played, the total bet amount will be deducted from the credit meter. When the game has finished the gaming machine will automatically calculate and display your winning credits.

A number of machines also include a 'Double Up' feature which gives you the opportunity to play for double or nothing on most wins.

To play 'Double Up' simply select the required button as indicated on the gaming machine screen or choose 'Take Win' to decline. If you win the 'Double Up', the original win is doubled and if you lose, the original win is forfeited.

To collect any credits on a gaming machine, simply press the 'Collect' button on your machine. Coins will dispense into the tray and for larger payouts you will be issued a payout slip by one of our friendly gaming attendants. You may redeem your payout slip at any Cashier.

Odds Of Winning

Gaming Machines in Casinos in Queensland are programmed to return an expected average rate of a minimum 90% or greater, to the player over a long period of time. This player return rate is not an outcome on a single game, but an average of many games on a machine over a period of time. The reason for this is that gaming machines use the concept of chance and randomness.

Chance is the likely outcome of a particular event and *randomness* is the order in which the outcome will occur. For instance, the *chance* of getting a 'head' or 'tail' when you toss a coin is 50/50 and there is no particular order in which the head or tail will occur this is called *randomness*.

As gaming machines have far more possibilities than a coin (to which only has two possibilities-head or tail) the *chance* and *randomness* of achieving a winning outcome is very different. Generally, the higher the prize the more unlikely it is to occur.
